

Kings Meadow Curriculum 2014 – 2015

- Our themes have a History or Geography focus with all other areas incorporated within them
- As with our previous curriculum, the 2014 curriculum map reflects the world we live in, the changes that have occurred, the impact on our lives and the impact we have on the world
- Organisation of learning is based on 3 termly cross curricula learning journeys focused on aspects of the world:

Cycle A: United World, Friendly World, One World

Cycle B: Our World, Adventure World, Changing World

- Each learning journey has a common link across the school and the three key stages of learning show a depth and progression of learning as shown below:
